

GRANT APPLICATION PROCEDURE

The North Carolina Bluebird Society (NCBS) has established an educational grant program to promote and provide suitable habitat for the Eastern Bluebird, as well as to increase awareness of the particular needs of this species and of other native cavity-nesting songbirds. Grants may be awarded to individuals and/or groups to:

- 1. Establish a new bluebird trail of nest boxes approved by the North American Bluebird Society.
- 2. Repair or replacement of nest boxes, poles and/or predator guards on existing trials.
- 3. Educational activities that specifically benefit the Eastern Bluebird.
- 4. The cost of a bluebird display or promotional materials.

All grant requests must be submitted using this application. Allow at least 6 weeks for your request to be reviewed by the Board of Directors. Any grant request submitted and awarded by the Board of the NCBS will not normally exceed \$200.00 but is not restricted to this amount.

Signature of the grantee guarantees the completion of the expressed project. The grantee will provide written notification of the success/failure of the project to the Board no later than one year from the award date. The signature of the grantee also releases the Board to publish the project and possible photographs in other NCBS publications.

Special instructions for projects that involve installing new bluebird trails or repairing/replacing existing nest boxes: The NCBS is pleased to be able to offer this grant to install nest boxes for Eastern Bluebirds and appreciates the efforts required to do so. It should be understood however, that placing nest boxes for bluebirds, or creating a nest box trail carries with it *a long-term commitment to*: (1) understand the purpose of the trail is to assist local populations of *native* cavity-nesting songbirds, (2) correctly site the nest boxes, (3) conduct the required weekly monitoring during the nesting season and, (4) perform the necessary maintenance and repair of the boxes each year thereafter. The NCBS will be happy to supply more information and guidance to make your project a success.
